Writing prompt: What would the Founding Fathers think of America today?

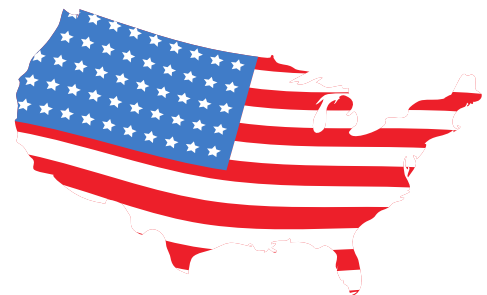
Writing prompt: My family's Fourth of July traditions are...

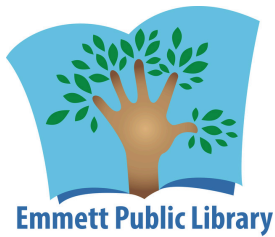
Writing prompt: Write a short story about someone your age living during the Revolutionary War.
